

There are year-round art and music festivals as well as a host of professional sporting events, including baseball, football and hockey.







Hands-on research opportunities


Marine biology, sustainability, and civil and ocean engineering

FAU's Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institute is a world-renowned research facility driving innovation in ocean engineering, at-sea operations, drug discovery and biotechnology from the oceans, coastal ecology and conservation, marine mammal research and conservation, aquaculture, ocean observing systems and marine science education.

FAU is also home to the Southeast National Marine Renewable Energy Center, a federally funded research facility that is developing technology to generate energy by harnessing the power of Florida's ocean currents.

Business, technology and life sciences

The Research Park at FAU is home to 22 companies employing nearly 1,000 people. It includes a Student Innovation and Invention Lab designed for use by FAU student teams working on industry projects. The Research Park is also home to the Technology Business Incubator (TBI), which currently houses 35 early-stage technology companies in

various industries such as pharmaceutical development, software development and logistics management for transportation and medical devices.

In addition to more than 244,000 square feet of laboratory space and other vital research facilities, FAU houses two fully-equipped, state-of-the-art nucleic acid and proteomics core laboratories, and an imaging laboratory which enable faculty and student researchers to perform cutting-edge research.


Undergraduate Research and Entrepreneurial Competition (Wave)

Employability activities such as research, internships and career fairs are available to you at all stages of your degree program.

Internships

The Internship Program is a unique educational program in which students integrate classroom study with periods of paid, supervised work experience related to their academic majors. At FAU, an internship is a structured experiential learning opportunity in which students apply concepts studied in the classroom to "real world" work situations. Employment Options/Advising

International students receive in-depth advising regarding employment options in the U.S. The F-1 visa allows eligible students to apply for Optional Practical Training (OPT) and gain employment authorization to work in their field of study for up to 12 months. Students in approved STEM fields may apply for a 24-month OPT extension. Participating in OPT provides graduates with a competitive advantage when seeking permanent employment opportunities.

Your entry options to FAU

Florida Atlantic University offers a number of programs to students with different levels of academic qualifications and English proficiency.

Direct admission

Applicants who meet FAU's undergraduate or graduate admission requirements may apply directly to FAU.

English language instruction

The language of instruction at FAU is English. To enter a Navitas at FAU program, you need to demonstrate English proficiency. Depending on your English language score, you may be required to take an academic English course to improve your academic reading and writing skills.

Undergraduate Pathway Program/ Pre-Master's Program

Navitas at FAU offers an Undergraduate Pathway Program (UPP) and Pre-Master's Program (PMP), both designed to prepare you for university studies in the United States. From the day you enroll in either program, you are an FAU student. Successful completion of the UPP/PMP ensures progression into a FAU degree program and credits earned towards that degree.

At Navitas at FAU, you will study at a premier university in the United States and earn university credit while learning from handpicked faculty who specialize in teaching international students.

Through Navitas at FAU, you are an FAU student from day one! This means you will:

- be eligible to apply for F-1 non-immigrant status covering the duration of your studies
- not need to re-apply to FAU when you enter the second year of your degree program
- be taught by FAU professors
- earn FAU credit, allowing you to complete your degree program as quickly as possible

- receive high-quality English language and academic skills support
- have access to all campus activities, facilities and be eligible for co-op education and internship opportunities.



Undergraduate Pathway Program (UPP)

The UPP is equivalent to the first year of a bachelor's degree. The UPP consists of for-credit courses, as well as non-credited support courses, and provides an academic and cultural bridge from your high school experience to studying for a university degree in the United States. Upon successful completion of the UPP, you will move directly into the second year of your chosen undergraduate degree program.

Program coursework

Program offerings in arts, business, computer science, design and social inquiry, education, engineering, science and social sciences include coursework that builds study skills coupled with university courses. Students who complete the UPP will earn 30 credits toward their bachelor's degree at FAU.

Program duration

Students may complete the UPP in two, three or four semesters, depending on their academic and English language entry requirements.

To meet the needs of academically advanced students, a two semester UPP has been developed to help students quickly progress through year one, while offering the same support and benefits as the three semester UPP.

Program highlight

The Department of Exercise Science & Health Promotion (ESHP) programs are designed to prepare students for careers in clinical, corporate, commercial and/or community physical fitness and wellness education. The American College of Sports Medicine (ACSM) and the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA) have reviewed our undergraduate curriculum and have provided National endorsement of the ESHP program.

Exercise science deals with the study of the immediate and long term effects of physical activity on the human body. Health promotion encompasses all of the components involved in the total wellbeing of an individual, exploring the social, spiritual, biological, emotional, physical and environmental aspects of optimal health.

Students also enjoy coming to the Student Union for concerts, comedy shows, speakers and plays.


Let's go to the movies


