

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
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# BOCA RATON: A city for all seasons

FAU is located just three miles from the Atlantic Ocean and the beautiful beach of Boca Raton. Boca Raton offers the charm of a small town, while the picturesque Mediterranean Revival architecture enchants visitors and residents alike.

Boca Raton is known to locals by its first name 'Boca' and for a small city with a population of approximately 90,000, it certainly has a lot to offer. Boca is located in Palm Beach County, the heart of Florida's Gold Coast.

## Climate

If you love warm weather with a breeze then Boca Raton is ideal for you. With an average of 231 sunny days per year, you will have endless beautiful days to enjoy and explore all that Boca Raton has to offer. The average July temperature high reaches 91°F (32°C) and January low of 58°F (15°C). The water is similarly warm at around 82°F (27°C).

## Things to see and do

The beautiful beaches of the Atlantic Ocean are less than five kilometers from campus, and the vibrant city life is just a short drive away. You will discover trendy shops, from vintage boutique to high-end, world-class designers. There are year-round art and music festivals as well as a host of professional sporting events, including baseball, football and hockey.



# MAKING WAVES AT FAU

- FAU is taking its place among the world's great research centers and has been given the designation of 'High Research Activity' university by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching.
  - The Research Park at FAU is home to 22 companies employing nearly 1,000 people. It includes a Student Innovation and Invention Lab designed for use by FAU student teams working on industry projects.
  - FAU is home to the Southeast National Marine Renewable Energy Center, a federally funded research facility that is developing technology to generate energy by harnessing the power of Florida's ocean currents.
  - FAU's Department of Finance was ranked 35th in the world (based on a compilation of published research in 16 core financial journals), and 2nd in the nation for published research in financial education.
  - FAU students from all 50 states, and more than 180 countries meet one another and form lasting relationships in the university's classrooms, labs, residence halls and dining establishments, as well as through the activities of 300 clubs and campus organizations.
- Typical early career starting salary is US\$44,400 for FAU graduates, as reported by PayScale.com. According to the same site, an MBA graduate from FAU can earn up to US\$122K per year.

# YOUR ENTRY OPTIONS TO FAU

Florida Atlantic University offers a number of programs to students with different levels of academics and English proficiency.

## Direct admission

Applicants who meet FAU's undergraduate or graduate admission requirements may apply directly to FAU.

## Undergraduate Pathway Program/ Pre-Master's Program

Navitas at FAU offers an Undergraduate Pathway Program (UPP) and Pre-Master's Program (PMP), both designed to prepare you for university studies in the United States. From the day you enroll in either program, you are an FAU student. Successful completion of the UPP/PMP ensures progression into a FAU degree program and credits earned towards that degree.

## English language instruction

The language of instruction at FAU is English. To enter a Navitas at FAU program, you need to demonstrate English proficiency. Depending on your English language score, you may be required to take an academic English course to improve your academic reading and writing skills.



# UNDERGRADUATE PATHWAY PROGRAM (UPP)

The UPP is equivalent to the first year of a bachelor's degree. The UPP consists of for-credit courses and provides an academic and cultural bridge from your high school experience to studying for a university degree in the United States. Upon successful completion of the UPP, you will move directly into the second year of your chosen undergraduate degree program.

## Program coursework

Program offerings in arts, business, computer science, design and social inquiry, education, engineering, science and social sciences include coursework that builds study skills coupled with university courses. Students who complete the UPP will earn 30 credits toward their bachelor's degree at FAU.

## Program duration

Students may complete the UPP in two, three or four semesters, depending on their academic and English language entry requirements.

To meet the needs of academically advanced students, a two semester UPP has been developed to help students quickly progress through year one, while offering the same support and benefits as the three semester UPP.

### UPP: 3 SEMESTERS - 1 YEAR (IELTS 5.5 / TOEFL 69)

### ESL + UPP: 4 SEMESTERS - 16 MONTHS (IELTS 4.5 / TOEFL 45)





FAU's Living Room Theater is a private theater where students can enjoy the latest blockbuster right on campus! Students get discounted tickets, which makes it the perfect little study break.



## City life
